Brewery	Beers	ABV	Tasting Notes
Anglo Dutch, West Yorkshire	Kletswater	4.0	OCTOBER BREW. A light amber session bitter with a biscuity finish. Kletswater is Dutch for “Waffle Water” (to talk endlessly - to 'whitter' on). One of the original Anglo Dutch brews.
Atlas, Argyll	Golden Amber	4.5	A light, floral, pale coloured beer with a delicate aftertaste of sweet honey and a refreshing gentle bitterness.
Barn gates, Cumbria	Cracker Ale	3.9	Copper coloured ale with a subtle hoppy aroma. Clean, smooth and well rounded with a long, bitter finish. Named after a regular's dog at the Drunken Duck (a Barn gates pub) – Cracker was plucky & cantankerous and not overly keen on children. Just our sort of dog!
Batemans, Lincolnshire	England Expects	4.0	SEASONAL SPECIAL. An amber coloured bitter with a blackcurrant fruit character and a rich maltiness on the finish. Brewed with English Goldings and Bramling Cross hops.
Blue Monkey, Derbyshire	BG Sips	4.0	A pale and intensely hoppy beer. Enticing tropical fruit aromas, finished with a good level of thirst quenching, almost peppery bitterness.
Bowland, Lancashire	Hen Harrier	4.0	Soft citrus and peach flavours combine to create a very easy drinking bitter.
Coach House, Warrington	Taverners Autumn Ale	5.0	SEASONAL SPECIAL. A gold coloured beer, fruity and bitter with a light, dry aftertaste.
Coastal, Cornwall	Angelina	4.1	A pleasurable golden bitter brewed with First Gold hops for a lingering, clean hop taste.
Corvedale, Shropshire	Farmer Ray's Ale	4.5	A clear, hazelnut brown coloured bitter. Aromas of pear drops, banana & pineapple, with a sharp, fruity, roasted malt taste.
Cotleigh, Somerset	Commando 'Hoofing'	4.0	Originally brewed to celebrate the return of the Royal Marines 40 Commando from deployment in Afghanistan. A refreshing pale golden beer with a fruit-filled finish. 'Hoofing' is Royal Marine slang to describe something fantastic - this beer is certainly that ... Hoofing!
Elland, West Yorkshire	Fireball	4.2	OCTOBER BREW. A copper coloured premium bitter with nutty Crystal Malt flavours and a long hoppy finish derived from Pilgrim & Pioneer hops.
Empire, West Yorkshire	Kismet	4.1	OCTOBER BREW. A pale, fruity aromatic bitter.
Fuzzy Duck, Lancashire	Tangerine Duck	4.4	Copper coloured beer with a hint of tangerine from the late addition of Crystal hops. Named after the local football team (Blackpool).
Gertie Sweet, Clwyd	British Maid	4.7	A golden blonde bitter. Smooth and crisp. Brewed with First Gold and Cascade hops.
Grafton, Nottinghamshire	Prowler	4.3	A classic amber bitter, smooth with an increasing hoppy finish.
Hornbeam, Manchester	Lemon Blossom	3.7	OCTOBER BREW. A delicious light ale with an aroma of crisp citrus lemon. Perfectly balanced sweetness with delicate bitterness to finish. An exceptional pale ale that leaves you wanting another.
Ilkley, West Yorkshire	Smoked Witch	5.0	OCTOBER BREW. A dark chestnut coloured beer, with a toffee / caramel flavour and a subtle smoky finish.
Itchen Valley, Hampshire	Green Jackets	4.5	OCTOBER BREW. Copper coloured ale with fruity hops on the nose and a dry, bitter finish.
Lymestone, Staffordshire	Ein Stein	5.0	Gentle biscuit malt, fresh Hersbrucke hops – it's not rocket science – it is “thinking drinking”!
North Yorkshire, Guisborough	Cereal Killer	4.5	OCTOBER BREW. An organic light coloured wheat beer with a distinctive hop nose. The finish is refreshingly dry & fruity.
Peerless, Wirral	Red Rocks	5.0	A strong, ruby ale named after the famous sandstone point in Hoylake on the Wirral. The red colour and rich malt flavours come from the use of caramelised rye, which are balanced with the fruity overtones from Bramling Cross hops.

Prospect, Lancashire	Panned Out	4.0	SEASONAL SPECIAL. A tawny Autumnal beer with full-bodied rounded bitterness and spicy notes.
Rudgate, York	Barristers Briefs	3.7	OCTOBER BREW. A distinctive pale ale with well-balanced malt and bitterness complimented by a refreshing hop nose.
Salopian, Shropshire	Icon	4.2	OCTOBER BREW. Straw yellow coloured ale with good body and hoppy fruit, yet with a crisp dry finish.
Spectrum, Norfolk	Black Buffle	4.5	Named after the brewer's cat, this is a smooth, full flavoured and easy-drinking stout. It's also vegan (unlike the cat).
Tirril, Cumbria	Barman's Ghoulies	4.0	OCTOBER BREW. A light, golden, hoppy ale.
Tirril, Cumbria	My Bloody Pint	4.4	OCTOBER BREW. A blood red ale.
York, Yorkshire	Scrum Down	4.3	SEASONAL SPECIAL. Brewed in celebration of the 2011 Rugby World Cup. A very dark, rich and distinctive ale with a roasted and chocolate malt finish.
